This year we planned the shoe event and we were supported by over 20 organisations in our communities, including schools, businesses and other voluntary groups. We raised over £2000.

MEMBERSHIP DRIVE

This year we have had a focus and campaign on increasing the membership at WomenCentre. This has now more than doubled and is steadily rising giving us unrestricted funds and a wider group of supporters.

Calderdale Services



Calderdale Staying Safe, the Domestic Abuse Service has continued to work with victims at all levels of risk. The services also provides domestic abuse support to children and young people. Over the year 1,228 adults & 52 children and young people have been supported.

Counselling was offered to 152 women and 6 women were supported by a new Eating Distress Group.

The Women Making Changes Big Lottery funded project has helped vulnerable and marginalised women in Calderdale to have financial security, suitable accommodation and social support to live better lives and avoid future hardship. 77 individual women recieved support.

Learning courses encouraged 160 women to share their experiences, helping them feel less isolated and start to build a more positive future.





Crisis Funds

Small grants from the Bearder Charity and the Community Foundation for Calderdale has provided
WomenCentre with an additional fund to offer financial support for food, utility costs and more to women who access our services in Calderdale.

Kirklees Services

Our Mental Health & Wellbeing Service has supported over 850 individual women across our Huddersfield and Dewsbury bases.

The WOW group continue to inform and shape our direct work and embed coproduced approaches.

We have also been working with Syrian women as part of the Syrian Resettlement programme.

A part of our wider offer in Kirklees, the Mother's Apart group has offered training and consultancy to wider audiences across the country.






Women in Exile

Our Women In Exile Service for refugee and asylum seeking women continues to support women to rebuild their lives & achieve a greater sense of safety & belonging within the local community.

PUBLICITY

We have developed new publicity materials across all services including infographics, new leaflets and banners to help us spread the word at events and to increase fundraising opportunities.



1325 GIRLS & YOUNG WOMEN PROJECT





Across Calderdale & Kirklees the 1325 Girls and Young Women Project funded by the Big Lottery offers a range of early intervention approaches to help girls and young women focus on times of distress and significant transitions in their lives.

There are fantastic examples of increased confidence with some amazing results including gaining an apprenticship and getting paid work.



CONNECTING OPPORTUNITIES

Our work on Connecting Opportunities started in July 2017, Our main role on this project is to work with the 9 partner organisations to support them to embed & enhance women-centred ways of working with new women migrants. We are doing this through workshops, direct sessions with partners as well as through creatively capturing women's voices by story-telling, through case studies and focus groups.

Bradford Service

In Bradford, WomenCentre delivers Bradford Maze (the Domestic Abuse Perpetrator Programme) which aims to increase the safety of victims (female and male) and children by working with perpetrators of domestic abuse.


ONE WOMAN'S STORY




